This is a step by step to journals, but please remember! You can always contact us to find an article, newspaper or magazine for you.


In this guide, I'll explain

- how to find a particular journal, issue and what options there are with Journal Finder
- where else you might find the journal and why there are multiple places to look



To find out if we have a magazine

1. Go to Journal Finder under Services.




2. Start searching your title on the next screen and pick from suggestions. If you cannot find the magazine you want, email us.




3. You are taken to a list of journals with the words searched in the titles.




- 4. Click on the plus sign next to *Full Text Access*, you can see all the resources that contain the full text of the magazine. You can click on any resource link you wish for full text. Note,
- You can also search the publication from this page
- The description includes the date range of issues in a publication . Note JSTOR coverage no recent issues!



5. Once you click on an option, you'll see a list of years of your publication available through that database. Click on the + next to the year and then the issues show underneath. Click on the issue.



6. The page below is what you'll see if you're using an EBSCO link. All the articles from that issue are listed on these results pages (usually about 1.5 pages of results for Foreign Affairs.




Note: Many journals have PDF full text which show color and text just as it appears in a print magazine. *Foreign Affairs* via EBSCO has only html, which is text only.

PressReader, Sora, Flipster

These resources also have journals in full color, but their coverage is only a few years and only <u>PressReader</u> is searchable by article topic. <u>Sora</u> and <u>Flipster</u> do not conect with *Journal Finder* but all their magazine titles are also in our library catalogue. Sora has current issues of the *New Yorker*, *Guardian Weekly*, *Bejing Review*, *Economist Asia*, etc. Flipster has the *Advocate*, the *New Internationalist*, *Mother Jones*, *The Nation* (and currently, a lot of other magazines that we don't pay for – shhhh).

Note: To search inside a magazine on PressReader, use advanced search.
