## Searching Google Scholar

**Important**: <u>Google Scholar</u> connects to our resources <u>while you are on campus</u>. (Click on link to the right of result and not the title.)

This document tells you how to search in, cite from, and find an entire article (instead of a paywall) on <u>Google Scholar</u>.

#### Searching techniques

- 1. Search keywords (e.g., first-wave feminism origins)
- 2. Narrow search by adding more words (e.g. first-wave feminism origins united states)
- 3. Search synonyms for your topic. e.g., women's rights, history
- 4. Get more results by taking out words or searching broader terms. e.g., women's rights

### Find newer items or items from a specific time-period

- 1. Click options under "Any time" to limit to certain years.
- 2. Click "Sort by date" to show the newer items first.

### Where is the entire article?

Abstracts/summaries are available for most of the articles. To read the entire article, you might need a subscription. Here are a few things to try:

- Click a link to the right of the search result, sometimes labeled [PDF], to the right. (The title often leads to a paywall.)
- Click "All versions" under the search result and check out the alternative sources.
- Try googling the article to find it free online through another journal/source. Search "article title" pdf.



If you want an article, and cannot find it the full text, put in a request for USIC to purchase the article.
