
A note about logging in: The first time using either USIC Search or a paid eResource on our website, you will receive a prompt to login with your school login (your email address and password). Some news and magazine resources, like the NYT, and the Economist ask you to create a login and password specific to that resource.

3. Select *New York Times*
4. Create a login with your school email address and choose a password.






If you have not logged into any resources on our site, you will be prompted to login to [PressReader](#) with your tas login.

To find other languages from within PressReader (not using links from our [languages page](#)).




Select language from button below. Chinese (Traditional) is one of the languages.




Pro Tip! To share a Spanish article, go to text mode after clicking on the article title.

(Unfortunately, text mode does not work for Chinese or Japanese 🙄. For these languages, you can share a *particular edition* of newspaper or magazine by copying the link at the top. Students should login to PressReader before using the link. Also, Asian editions that are in English sometimes show up under Chinese.)

For sharing a particular article in Spanish, choose print to PDF (it's OK to distribute an article for educational reasons, or course, but there is a watermark), or copy the contents of the article and paste to Google Docs or Word.




App Available!

To use the app, search for *PressReader* in your app store. Follow the below instructions to use the app.


Setting Up the App




Select Login from first page



Using USIC Search and Limiting by Language

USIC Search is the default search on our website. It searches all of our database academic articles and some of our news sources.




Once we hit search, we will see the below result list and screen.




Narrowing a Search by Language

Now use the *limiters* on the left side of your search results to help you limit your results to language. Choose *Language* and then choose *Show More*.



The languages are ordered by number of results so scroll through and check the one you need. For *Dogs*, I found Japanese, Chinese and Spanish.



Once I chose the language(s), they are visible on the left side with the limiters.

There are many options on how to share these items once you find an article on the left-hand side of the article.
